

Fortunately, Tiki is smart enough to handle this, thanks to an exciting feature: "URL Suffix Cleaner".

## What it does

Concretely, when this feature is enabled, if a requested page is not found, it tries to remove one or two characters from the end of the URL to see if it gets a perfect match with an existing working page, and if so, it redirects the user to that

## How to use

As Tiki gives us the possibility to use only what we want, the URL Suffix Cleaner feature must be activated before we can use it


## Steps to activate

- From your System menu click on Settings (You must be an admin)
- Under the dropdown select Control Panels





• This being an advanced feature, you need to turn on "Advanced" under Preference Filters




Click to expand

• Then under Global Setup, Click on General Settings to open the General Settings page

• Under the Navigation tab on the General Settings page, find a section called "Redirects"



Click to expand

• Scroll down a little bit to find the URL Suffix Cleaner feature, and check the box to activate it



Click to expand

• Finally click on Apply button (at the bottom of the page) to apply your changes. A success message will pop up at the top of the page




